Master's programme Linguistics (MA Linguistics)

§ 1 The study programme

The MA Linguistics is aimed at graduates of linguistic or philological bachelors' programmes. Students expand and deepen their analytical linguistic knowledge and skills in one of the following areas: General Linguistics, English Linguistics, German Linguistics, Romance Linguistics or Slavic Linguistics.

A double-degree (DD) option is available for the MA Linguistics. In this case, students either spend the first year of studies at the University of Konstanz and the second year at the Università di Verona ("home university" Konstanz), or they spend the first year at the Università di Verona and the second year at the University of Konstanz ("home university" Università di Verona). The DD option is an extra area of specialization.

§ 2 Required ECTS credits

The MA Linguistics consists of seven modules. Students have to acquire a total of 120 ECTS¹ credits (cr). 54 cr have to be earned in the general area (Modules 1 and 2 as well as 7) and 66 cr in the respective area of specialization (Modules 3 to 6).

¹ **Explanation of abbreviations:** DD = double degree; ECTS cr = credits in line with the European Credit Transfer System; P/WP = obligatory / required elective; Art = course type (VL = lecture, Sem = seminar; Ü = practical tutorial); SL = coursework; PL = assessment (HA = written assignment, KI = written exam, Ref = oral presentation; So = other form of written/oral assessment; var = variable: the assessment type will be announced by the course instructor at the beginning of the course); Sem. = semester(s) in which the course has to be attended, ENR = contributing to the final grade.

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§ 3 Special provisions for the double-degree option

(1) Based on the cooperation agreement with Università di Verona on offering a DD option, students can complete this study programme with a double degree. The provisions apply as outlined in the agreement between the Universities of Verona and Konstanz.

(2) In the DD option, students acquire a master's degree at both partner universities if the following requirements are met:

1. Complete documentation of the successfully completed first year of studies (60 ECTS credits) in the master's programme (DD option) at the home university.
2. Successful completion of the second year of studies in the master's programme (DD option) at the other university.
3. The universities mutually recognize the work students complete in line with the regulations described in the appendix, stating that coursework and performance assessments completed in the study programme Linguistics at the Università di Verona are recognized for the MA Linguistics in Konstanz and vice versa.
4. The grades achieved in coursework and performance assessments are converted using the subject-specific grade conversion table (see appendix).
5. The overall grade of the master's examination is determined as described in § 8.

§ 4 Content of the study programme

The subject of the programme is the theoretical description and analysis of linguistic structures and their formalization. The MA Linguistics provides the necessary knowledge and skills to pursue an academic career. Students will also be able to deal professionally with theoretical and practical linguistic issues and to practise language-centred professions. The study programme imparts analytical and methodical competence and, depending on the area of specialization, the synchronic and/or diachronic analysis of one or more languages is deepened. Good knowledge of English is required (Level B2). A stay abroad at a university outside of Germany is highly recommended (creditable in Module 6).

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§ 4.1 Modules for all areas of specialization

Module 1 deepens the already acquired knowledge in the core areas by means of exercises and texts. The module is completed when students have acquired 18 cr from different parts of the module.

Module 2 provides methodological skills for research in linguistics. The module is completed when students have acquired 12 cr from different parts of the module.

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Module 7: Research, master's thesis and oral examination, compulsory module, 24 cr

In the final module of the programme, students write the master's thesis and take the oral master's examination.

*Students who write their master's thesis at the Università di Verona receive 21 ECTS credits, since the master's thesis there is more extensive than at the University of Konstanz. In turn, these students do not have to complete the research colloquium.

§ 4.2 Area of specialization General Linguistics

The area of specialization General Linguistics has a focus on theoretical linguistics including interface research. The teaching and examination languages are usually German and English.

In the field of linguistics, students can take seminars on other linguistic topics. In the field of neighbouring areas, they can take seminars on other subjects such as literature, art, media, psychology, philosophy, computer science, mathematics and statistics. Students can choose any language other than English as language practice, including German as a foreign language; transferable skills courses must be creditable for masters' programmes. A semester abroad is highly recommended. The suggested point of time for going abroad is Semester 2 and/or 3. The module is completed when students have acquired 21 cr.

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§ 4.3 Area of specialization English Linguistics

The area of specialization English Linguistics has a linguistic focus on English and is concerned with variation and the acquisition of the English language system. The teaching and examination language is usually English.

In the field of linguistics, students can take seminars on other linguistic topics. In the field of neighbouring areas, they can take seminars on other subjects such as literature, art, media, psychology, philosophy, computer science, mathematics and statistics. Students should choose English for language practice; the transferable skills courses must be creditable for masters' programmes. A semester abroad in an English-speaking country is highly recommended. The suggested point of time for going abroad is Semester 2 and/or 3. The module is completed when students have acquired 21 cr.

§ 4.7 Area of specialization Double-Degree Option with the Università di Verona

In the double degree (DD) option, students focus on theoretical linguistics and apply it to social issues such as multilingualism and language policy. The teaching and examination language is usually English.

§ 6 Course and examination languages

Courses are held in German, English or one of the languages studied. The examination language can be German, English or one of the languages studied.

§ 7 Master's examination

(1) Students have to complete the course-related performance assessments specified in § 2 in Modules 1 to 7.

(2) Final examination

Master's thesis as per § 22 of the general study and examination regulations: Students have to complete the thesis within four months and have to show that they are able to work independently according to scientific principles in a limited field (18 cr). Deviating from this, students writing their master's thesis at the Università di Verona receive 21 ECTS credits, as the master's thesis there is more extensive than at the University of Konstanz. In turn, these students do not have to complete the research colloquium (Module 7).

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1. The master's thesis is written in German, English or one of the languages studied.
Students in the DD option with the Università di Verona have to write their master's thesis in English. If all parties agree, it can also be written in another modern foreign language. In this case, an English abstract of the thesis is also required. The master's thesis of DD students is assessed by one reviewer each from the University of Konstanz and the Università di Verona.
2. Final oral examination (3 cr, 30 minutes)
The final oral examination includes a colloquium on the topic of the master's thesis and an examination of the linguistic basics. It is held in German, English or one of the languages studied.
For DD students, the oral examination is in English. With the approval of the examiners, it can also take place in German or Italian. If possible, one examiner from each of the two partner universities will conduct the examination. The final oral examination is a colloquium on the topic of the master's thesis.

§ 8 Calculation of the overall grade

The overall grade is calculated as follows:

Grades for each of the Modules 1 through 5 are calculated as the arithmetic mean of the module part grades of the module units that are relevant for the final grade, weighted according to ECTS credits.

The grades for Modules 1 through 5 and Module 7 count towards the final grade, according to the number of relevant ECTS credits.

The grade for Module 7 is calculated as follows: The grade for the master's thesis is multiplied by three; the grade for the oral examination is not multiplied.

Module 6 does not count towards the final grade.

§ 9 Effective date and transitional provisions

- (1) The German version of these subject-specific regulations comes into effect on 1 October 2023.
- (2) At the same time the previously valid version of the subject-specific regulations dated 14 June 2017 (*Amtliche Bekanntmachungen* 'official announcements' 24/2017), amended on 11 March 2021 (*Amtliche Bekanntmachungen* 10/2021), expires.
