- Exchange students in the Departmental section of History (like students of any other host department) are free to choose courses across programmes, departments and even faculties as long as they fulfil the necessary prerequisites (e.g. prior knowledge (methodology) in a discipline) and the course is available.
- In the Departmental section of History it is mostly introductory lectures on B.A. level for students in lower semesters that are on offer repetitively. After the fundamental introduction to their discipline, students choose from a set of elective seminars. The topics of those seminars change every semester. Therefore, we advise incoming students to look at past semester's course catalogues in order to get a general idea what the offer usually looks like.
- Currently, a majority of English taught seminars are open to both B.A. and M.A. students (the latter completing e.g. additional reading and assessments).
- In many courses that usually only award 3 ECTS, Erasmus students can also opt for 6 ECTS by completing an additional assessment.

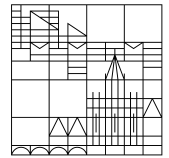

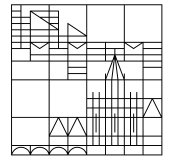
